The Judges of the Cuyahoga County Court of Common Pleas, Domestic Relations Division make the following findings of fact:

1. Whereas Ohio Civil Rule 4.1(A)(1)(a) provides for *Service by United States certified or express mail* evidenced by return receipt signed by any person;
2. Whereas due to COVID-19, the United States Postal Service has adapted its certified mail delivery procedure to promote social distancing whereby carriers will obtain a name instead of a signature and enter it on a mobile device as confirmation of delivery; and
3. Whereas section (C) of the Ohio Supreme Court's March 27, 2020 Administrative Action allows for waiver of in-person service and appearance or service by the use of technology;


IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

1. Delivery of service of process may be evidenced by delivery of certified mail or express mail by the United States Postal Service in the above-described manner;
2. The Clerk of Courts may enter the fact of the delivery on the docket; and
3. Service in this manner shall be deemed to be perfected unless otherwise challenged.
