Cuyahoga County Domestic Relations Court Launches New Website

CLEVELAND – The Domestic Relations Division of the Common Pleas Court has announced the launch of its newly redesigned website.

“Our mission is, ‘To help families restructure their lives by reaching compassionate and just resolutions to parenting and property disputes.’ We understand that court systems can be difficult to navigate,” Administrative Judge Rosemary Grdina Gold said. “One of the Court’s strategic goals is to provide the public with comprehensive, useful information that is easy to understand and easy to access. This website allows us to better serve the diverse community of Cuyahoga County.”

The website has been modernized to become more customer service friendly while moving forward with technological advances to improve functionality and provide users with optimum navigation capability using multiple devices. The site introduces a fresh, visually appealing new look and enhanced interactive features. Users can now search the court calendar by judge, magistrate, attorney, case name, and case number. Visitors can also use Google Translate to translate the site into 103 different languages and Google Maps to get directions and plan routes. Parties with parenting disputes can submit mediation requests online. Locally approved, downloadable and fillable court forms with instructions are available, at no cost.

Essential information about family law, court processes, and helpful resources has been updated. Visitors can stay informed with *News and Recent Changes* featuring the latest announcements and happenings in the Cuyahoga County Domestic Relations Court.

Content will be regularly updated with information on court services and programs, rule changes, court statistics and performance measures, and how documents can be electronically filed, when e-filing becomes operational.

“Fairness, transparency, and accessibility to timely justice are our highest concerns. Technology upgrades help us meet our responsibilities to the community and our justice system partners,” Gold said. “We hope our redesigned website improves the experience of all visitors, whether attorneys, parties, or the general public.” Gold thanked the Cuyahoga County Department of Information Technology and the court’s website committee for their hard work in designing the site and developing site content.
